
NATIONAL POETRY MONTH Fiction Books



The Collected Works of Langston Hughes- Although best known as a poet, Langston Hughes was also the author of two novels that richly evoke the black experience in America. Not without Laughter and Tambourines to Glory reflect the early and late vision of one of the twentieth century's most distinguished men of letters.

Girls Got Game: sports stories & Poems - A collection of short stories and poems written by and about young women in sports.

The Coyote Road Trickster Tales-- A collection of stories and poems about tricksters in all parts of the world by a variety of authors.



The Clay Marble- A collection of poems, short stories, and essays by Asian, Latin American, and U.S. authors.
