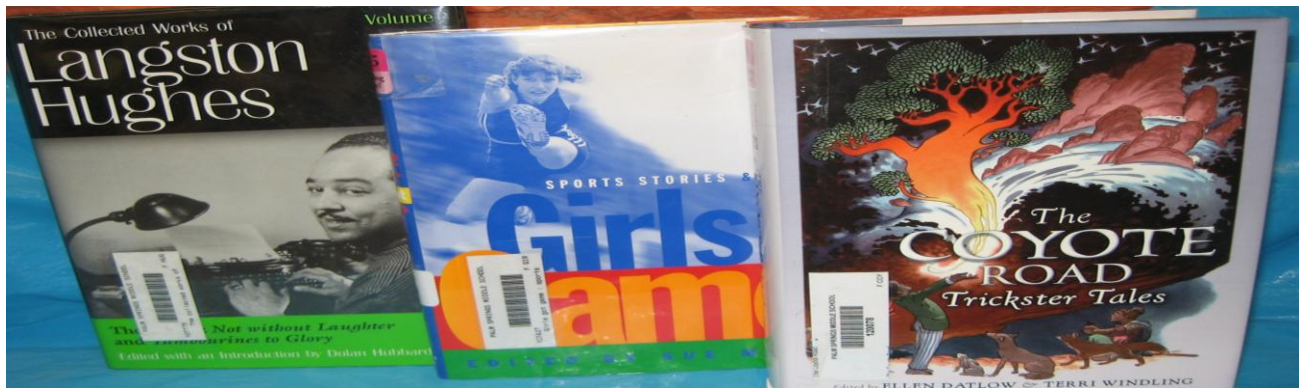

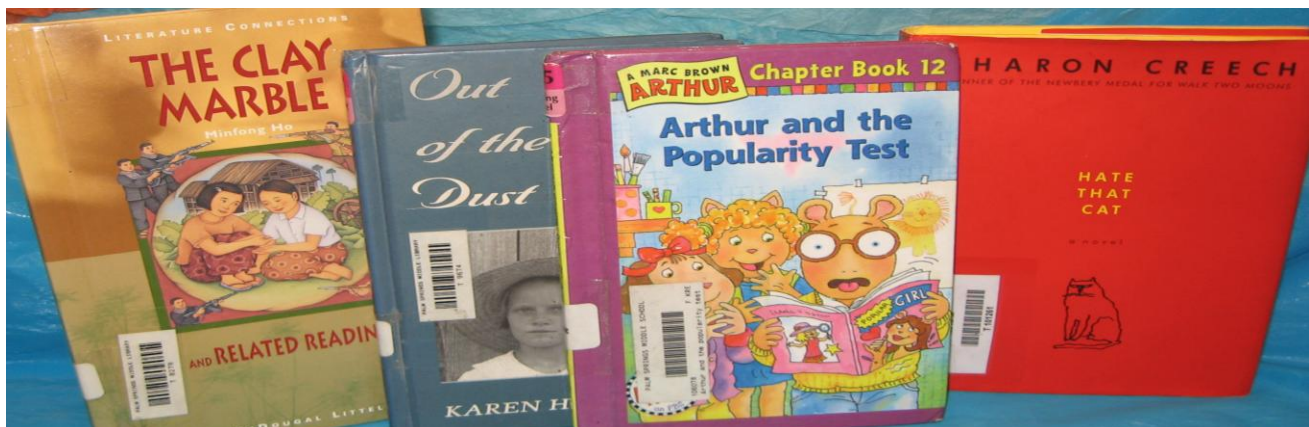
Fiction Books



The Collected Works of Langston Hughes- Although best known as a poet, Langston Hughes was also the author of two novels that richly evoke the black experience in America. *Not without Laughter* and *Tambourines to Glory* reflect the early and late vision of one of the twentieth century's most distinguished men of letters.

Girls Got Game: sports stories & Poems- A collection of short stories and poems written by and about young women in sports.

The Coyote Road Trickster Tales-- A collection of stories and poems about tricksters in all parts of the world by a variety of authors.



The Clay Marble- A collection of poems, short stories, and essays by Asian, Latin American, and U.S. authors.

Out of the Dust-

In a series of poems, fifteen-year-old Billie Jo relates the hardships of living on her family's wheat farm in Oklahoma during the dust bowl years of the Depression.
