

NATIONAL POETRY MONTH



Carver, a life in poems- A collection of poems that combine to provide a portrait of the life of nineteenth-century African-American botanist and inventor George Washington Carver.

The Stone Lamp: Eight Stories of Hanukkah Through History- Relates eight incidents from throughout the history of Judaism, each followed by a free-verse poem, told in the voice of a child from that time, who is celebrating one night of Hanukkah and the resilience of the Jewish people.

Cool Salsa: bilingual poems on growing up Latino in the United States- Celebrates the tones, rhythms, sounds, and experiences of growing up Latino in America. Includes works by poets such as Sandra Cisneros, Martín Espada, Gary Soto, Ed Vega, and others.



Shadow: From the French of Blaise Cendrars-Free verse evocation of the eerie, shifting images of Shadow which represents the beliefs and ghosts of the past and is brought to life wherever there is light, fire, and a storyteller.

A Thousand Peaks: poems from China- A collection of thirty-five Chinese poems spanning nineteen centuries that provides background information on the times and poets, and presents each work in English verse, Chinese, Chinese characters, and literal English translation.

Words with Wings: a treasury of African-American poetry in art- Pairs twenty works of art by African-American artists with twenty poems by twenty African-American poets.
