
## NATIONAL POETRY MONTH



*Walt Whitman (Leaves of Grass)* - A collection of poems published as a tribute to America and revised by Whitman in 1892. "Whitman's best poems have that permanent quality of being freshly painted, of not being dulled by the varnish of the years." –Malcolm Cowley

*John Keats: Selected Poetry-* This selection, chosen from the Oxford Authors critical edition of Keats's major works, demonstrates the remarkable growth in maturity of his verse, from early poems such as 'Imitation of Spenser' and 'Ode to Apollo' to later work such as 'The Eve of St Agnes', 'Ode to a Nightingale', and 'To Autumn'. Elizabeth Cook's introduction, notes, and glossary of classical names offer helpful insights into Keats's life and work.



*E.E. Cummings (A poet's life)* - Examines the life and writings of American poet E. E. Cummings. Includes photographs, glossary and list of published works.

(*Series: Women in Profile*) *Writers-* Introduces the lives and literary accomplishments of such women writers as Maya Angelou, Judy Blume, Astrid Lindgren, Jean Little, Lucy Maud Montgomery, and Beatrix Potter.

(Series: The Importance Of) James Baldwin- Discusses the life of James Baldwin, his activism in civil rights, and the importance of his writings.
