<b>Position Statement</b>	The position statement provides a clear, strong statement of the author's position on the topic. <b>Support for Position</b>	Includes 3 or more pieces of evidence (facts, statistics, examples, real-life experiences) that support the position statement. The writer anticipates the reader's concerns, biases or arguments and has provided at least 1 counter-argument.	Includes 3 or more pieces of evidence (facts, statistics, examples, real-life experiences) that support the position statement.	Includes 2 pieces of evidence (facts, statistics, examples, real-life experiences) that support the position statement. <b>Capitalization &amp; Punctuation</b>	Author makes no errors in capitalization or punctuation, so the essay is exceptionally easy to read. *A Persuasive Essay (Argumentative Writing) requires a clear statement of opinion, evidence supporting that opinion, and responses to possible objections.*
